**DATE: OCTOBER 10, 2025
9AM-2PM**

Any high school student who is interested in participating in the 2025 Envirothon is invited to attend the training session, which **takes place at Cotton Park, Stratford.**

Experts in the 4 core topics deliver training and education to the students, designed to assist them with preparing for the upcoming competition. This is an invaluable experience for students who plan on competing in PEI Envirothon, and are *strongly encouraged* to attend.

Interested students/teams are invited to access the resources that are available for all four core topics AND the Current Environmental Issue. These resources, which are a mix of written material and video, are handpicked to ensure the students are ready for the event. They give the students a solid understanding of the topics, and will help them during the challenge and oral presentation at the PEI competition. They are available at any time.

Competition

DATE: NOVEMBER 7-8, 2025

Students will be in the field for the morning, being tested on the various core topics; this takes place at a different location each year. The teams will then move to **Canoe Cove Christian Camp** for the remainder of the competition. They will be presented with a scenario & challenge, where they will collectively come up with their solution(s) to this real-world problem. They will deliver an team-based oral presentation, and the scores will be tabulated and winners announced!
