

Registered Hunting Guide or Outfitter Licence Application Form

Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy

Personal information on this form is collected under section 31 (c) of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, c. F-15.01, as it relates directly to and is necessary for the provision of a Registered Hunting Guide Licence and Registered Hunting Outfitter Licence as established under the *Wildlife Conservation Act* Hunting Guide Regulations. Anyone who accompanies more than two non-resident hunters at a time or anyone who accompanies hunters for profit must have a Registered Hunting Guide Licence. To be eligible for a Registered Hunting Guide Licence, all applicants:

- 1) must be in possession of a valid PEI Wildlife Card. (Non-residents will be issued a temporary PEI Wildlife Card provided they have met the hunter safety requirements for their respective province/state);
- 2) must be 19 years of age or older at the time of application;
- 3) must have a valid PEI hunting licence;
- 4) must have a valid emergency first aid and CPR certificate;
- 5) must pass a competency test which confirms their knowledge of applicable legislation, hunting practices, firearm and hunter safety, and other related topics; and
- 6) must have a valid Firearms Possession and Acquisition Licence (PAL).

A **registered outfitter** is a person who holds a valid PEI hunting licence, as well as a Registered Hunting Outfitter Licence. This allows the person to provide services, equipment, guides or guiding services, in relation to hunting.
