Pursuant to section 4 of the Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-5 Council granted permission to Doris Gillick of Toronto, Ontario to acquire a land holding of approximately fifteen decimal seven (15.7) acres of land in Lot 47, Kings County, Province of Prince Edward Island, being acquired from Complex Inc. of Souris, Prince Edward Island.

PLANNING ACT SUBDIVISION AND DEVELOPMENT REGULATIONS **AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to sections 8 and 8.1 of the *Planning Act R.S.P.E.I.* 1988, Cap. P-8, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Section 63 of the Planning Act Subdivision and Development Regulations (EC693/00) is amended
 - (a) by the addition of the following after subsection (5):
- (5.1) Notwithstanding clause 4(c), where the intended use is resource- Idem commercial or resource-industrial within a municipality that has an official plan, subdivisions of more than one lot per parcel of land may be approved where an irrevocable agreement has been signed between the developer and a municipal sewerage or water utility to provide central sewerage or central water service, or both if available, to all lots prior to the conveyance of any lot from the approved subdivision.
 - (b) in clause (7)(c), by the deletion of the words "subsections (4) and clauses (5)(a) and (b)" and the substitution of the words "subsections (4), (5) and (5.1) and remnant parcels resulting from such subdivisions";
 - (c) in clause (7)(d), by the deletion of the words "clause (5)(c)" and the substitution of the words "clause (5)(c) and subsection (5.1)"; and
 - (d) in clause (9), by the deletion of the words "(4), (5) and (7)" and the substitution of the words "(4), (5), (5.1) and (7)".
- 2. These regulations come into force on April 30, 2005.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

The amendments provide for the same exception respecting subdivisions of more than one lot for residential use as for subdivisions of more than one lot for resource-commercial or resource-industrial use. The amendments also add references to the new subsection (5.1) in other subsections, and includes a reference to remnant land in subsection (7).
