EXECUTIVE COUNCIL ACT

 THE GOVERNMENT OF CANADA

Pursuant to clause 10(a) of the *Executive Council Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. E-12 Council authorized the Minister of Environment, Labour and Justice to enter into an agreement with the Government of Canada, as represented by the Minister of Industry, to provide for the disclosure of data on the circumstance of death by the Chief Coroner for Prince Edward Island to Statistics Canada, such as more particularly described in the draft agreement. Council noted that disclosure of this data is subject to section 39 of the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. F-15.01. Further, Council noted that a national data base of information on all deaths investigated by the Chief Coroners and Chief Medical Examiners of the provinces and territories will be used to identify statistical trends in underlying causes of death across jurisdictions, with the objective of contributing to a decrease in preventable deaths across Canada.

EC2014-754**REGULATED HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT
EXEMPTION REGULATIONS**

Pursuant to subsection 96(1) of the *Regulated Health Professions Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-10.1, Council made the following regulations:

A person who</p> <p style="padding-left: 2em;">(a) is not registered as a pharmacist, pharmacy technician, pharmacy intern or pharmacy student under the Pharmacist and Pharmacy Technician Profession Regulations (EC533/14); and</p> <p style="padding-left: 2em;">(b) is employed in a dispensary in a hospital or health facility operated by the Government or Health PEI,</p> <p>is exempt from the prohibition of clause 86(1)(h) of the Act in respect of the dispensing or compounding of drugs performed by the person in the scope of his or her employment.</p> | Exemption |
| <p>2. These regulation are revoked on December 31, 2018.</p> | Revocation |
| <p>3. These regulations come into force on December 20, 2014.</p> | Commencement |

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 provides an exemption from the prohibition in clause 86(1)(h) of the Act with respect to persons employed in a hospital or health facility dispensary to compound or dispense drugs. This exemption will expire on December 31, 2018.

SECTION 2 provides for the revocation of the regulations on December 31, 2018.

SECTION 3 provides for the commencement of these regulations.
