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**HIGHWAY TRAFFIC ACT
DEMERIT POINT SYSTEM REGULATIONS
AMENDMENT**

Pursuant to section 284 of the *Highway Traffic Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. H-5, Council made the following regulations:

- 1. Item 13 of the Schedule to the *Highway Traffic Act* Demerit Point System Regulations (EC1216/80) is amended by the deletion of the word “8” and the substitution of the word “12”.**
- 2. These regulations come into force on December 8, 2018.**

EXPLANATORY NOTE

SECTION 1 amends the Schedule to provide that, where a person is convicted of contravening subsection 202(1) of the *Highway Traffic Act* by failing to stop for a school bus when the flashing red lights are displayed on the school bus, 12 demerit points will be entered on the person’s driving record.

SECTION 2 provides for the commencement of these regulations.

LANDS PROTECTION ACT
PROPERTY NO. 1052752, LOT 27, PRINCE COUNTY
IDENTIFICATION FOR NON-DEVELOPMENT USE
AMENDMENT

Pursuant to subsection 9(2) of the *Prince Edward Island Lands Protection Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-5, Council amended the condition of non-development use made pursuant to section 2 of the Land Identification Regulations (EC606/95) in respect of approximately seventy-five decimal five (75.5) acres of land, being Provincial Property No. 1052752 located at Chelton, Lot 27, Prince County, Prince Edward Island and currently owned by Andre Bellerive of Chelton, Prince Edward Island.

Council noted that this amendment will enable subdivision of a parcel of land of approximately three (3) acres for residential use, and determined that following subdivision, identification for non-development use shall continue to apply to the remaining land.

This Order-in-Council comes into force on November 27, 2018.
