REGULATED HEALTH PROFESSIONS ACT
PHARMACIST AND PHARMACY TECHNICIAN REGULATIONS
AMENDMENT

Pursuant to sections 2 and 96 of the *Regulated Health Professions Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-10.1, Council made the following regulations:

1. (1) **Clause 17(1)(i) of the *Regulated Health Professions Act* Pharmacist and Pharmacy Technician Regulations (EC445/19) is amended by the addition of the words “ordering and” immediately before the word “interpreting”.**
- (2) **Subsection 17(3) of the regulations is revoked.**
2. **Subsection 43(1) of the regulations is amended**
 - (a) **in clause (b), by the deletion of the period and the substitution of a semicolon; and**

- (b) **by the addition of the following after clause (b):**
 - (c) performing a procedure on tissue below the dermis to collect blood to monitor and manage drug therapy using a point-of-care testing device.
3. **Schedule C of the regulations is amended by the revocation of clause (z) and the substitution of the following:**
- (z) pharyngitis (sore throat);
 - (z.1) streptococcal pharyngitis (strep throat);
4. **These regulations come into force on April 5, 2025.**

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 amends section 17 of the regulations to provide for any pharmacist, not only a hospital pharmacist, to order, as well as interpret, screening and diagnostic tests that do not use forms of energy to monitor and manage drug therapy.

SECTION 2 amends subsection 43(1) of the regulations to provide for pharmacy technicians to perform the reserved activity of performing a procedure on tissue below the dermis to collect blood to monitor and manage drug therapy using a point-of-care testing device.

SECTION 3 amends Schedule C of the regulations to add streptococcal pharyngitis (strep throat) to the list of common ailments and to update the wording in clause (z) for consistency.

SECTION 4 provides for the commencement of these regulations.

REGISTERED NURSES AND REGISTERED PSYCHIATRIC NURSES REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to sections 2 and 96 of the *Regulated Health Professions Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. R-10.1, Council made the following regulations:

1. (1) **Subsection 13(1) of the *Regulated Health Professions Act Registered Nurses and Registered Psychiatric Nurses Regulations (EC551/23)* is amended by the deletion of the words “Subject to subsection (2)” and the substitution of the words “Subject to subsections (2) and (3)”.**
- (2) **Subsection 13(3) of the regulations is revoked and the following substituted:**
- Exceptions**
- (3) Notwithstanding subsection (2), a registered nurse is authorized to perform the following reserved activities under the specified conditions:
- (a) administering by any means, a drug or vaccine prescribed by
 - (i) a registered nurse with a special authorization issued under section 13.1,
 - (ii) a registered psychiatric nurse with a special authorization issued under section 23.10, or

- (iii) a person authorized to practise as a pharmacist under the laws of this province;
- (b) performing a procedure on tissue below the dermis to collect blood for a screening or diagnostic test ordered by
 - (i) a registered nurse with a special authorization issued under section 13.1,
 - (ii) a registered psychiatric nurse with a special authorization issued under section 23.10, or
 - (iii) a person authorized to practise as a pharmacist under the laws of this province.

2. Section 23 of the regulations is amended

- (a) **by the revocation of clause (a) and the substitution of the following:**
 - (a) diagnosing a disease, disorder or condition and communicating the diagnosis in circumstances in which it is reasonably foreseeable that it will be relied on in health care decisions;
- (b) **by the revocation of clauses (j) and (k) and the substitution of the following:**
 - (j) applying sound or electrical energy, other than ionizing radiation;
 - (k) ordering the application of electrical, electromagnetic or sound energy;
- (c) **in clause (n), by the deletion of the period and the substitution of a semicolon; and**
- (d) **by the addition of the following after clause (n):**
 - (o) performing a psycho-social intervention with an expectation of modifying a substantial disorder of thought, mood, perception, orientation or memory that grossly impairs judgment, behaviour, the capacity to recognize reality or the ability to meet the ordinary demands of life.

3. (1) Subsection 23.9(1) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the words “Subject to subsection (2)” and the substitution of the words “Subject to subsections (2) and (3)”.

(2) Subsection 23.9(2) of the regulations is amended by the deletion of the words “subsection (1)” and the substitution of the words “clauses (1)(a) to (e)”.

(3) Subsection 23.9(3) of the regulations is revoked and the following substituted:

Exceptions

- (3) Notwithstanding subsection (2), a registered psychiatric nurse is authorized to perform the following reserved activities under the specified conditions:
 - (a) administering by any means, a drug or vaccine prescribed by
 - (i) a registered nurse with a special authorization issued under section 13.1,
 - (ii) a registered psychiatric nurse with a special authorization issued under section 23.10, or
 - (iii) a person authorized to practise as a pharmacist under the laws of this province;
 - (b) performing a procedure on tissue below the dermis to collect blood for a screening or diagnostic test ordered by
 - (i) a registered nurse with a special authorization issued under section 13.1,
 - (ii) a registered psychiatric nurse with a special authorization issued under section 23.10, or
 - (iii) a person authorized to practise as a pharmacist under the laws of this province.

4. **These regulations come into force on April 5, 2025.**

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 amends section 13 of the regulations to provide for a registered nurse to perform certain specified reserved activities in specified conditions in exception to the condition of an order or protocol under subsection (2).

SECTION 2 amends section 23 of the regulations to add reserved activities to the list of reserved activities that a nurse practitioner may perform.

SECTION 3 amends section 23.9 of the regulations to remove the condition of an order or protocol under subsection (2) in respect of a registered psychiatric nurse performing a psycho-social intervention. It also provides for a registered psychiatric nurse to perform certain specified reserved activities in specified conditions in exception to the condition of an order or protocol under subsection (2).

SECTION 4 provides for the commencement of these regulations.

SECURITIES ACT

REGULATIONS AMENDMENT

Pursuant to section 168 of the *Securities Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. S-3.1, Council made the following regulations:

1. (1) **Subsection 2(1) of the Schedule to the *Securities Act* Regulations (EC57/08) is revoked and the following substituted:**
2. (1) Subject to subsection (3), the fee payable
 - (a) in the case of an issuer, other than an investment fund,
 - (i) filing a preliminary prospectus or pro forma prospectus is \$850 for each issuer, or
 - (ii) filing a prospectus for which no preliminary or pro forma prospectus was filed is \$850 for each issuer;
 - (b) in the case of an investment fund, other than a mutual fund or an exchange-traded mutual fund as defined in National Instrument 41-101 General Prospectus Requirements,
 - (i) filing a preliminary prospectus or pro forma prospectus in Form 41-101F2 under National Instrument 41-101 General Prospectus Requirements, is \$850 for each investment fund, or
 - (ii) filing a preliminary or pro forma scholarship plan prospectus in Form 41-101F3 under National Instrument 41-101 General Prospectus Requirements, is \$850 for each investment fund;
 - (c) in the case of an exchange-traded mutual fund, as defined in section 1.1 of National Instrument 41-101 General Prospectus Requirements,
 - (i) filing a preliminary or pro forma ETF facts document in Form 41-101F4 under National Instrument 41-101 General Prospectus Requirements, is \$850 for each exchange-traded mutual fund, or
 - (ii) filing an ETF facts document in Form 41-101F4 for which no preliminary, pro forma or final prospectus was filed as contemplated in section 3D.1 of National Instrument 41-101

- General Prospectus Requirements, is \$850 for each exchange-traded mutual fund; and
- (d) in the case of a mutual fund
 - (i) filing a preliminary or pro forma fund facts document in Form 81-101F3 under National Instrument 81-101 Mutual Fund Prospectus Disclosure, is \$850 for each mutual fund, or
 - (ii) filing a fund facts document in Form 81-101F3 for which no preliminary, pro forma or simplified prospectus was filed as contemplated in subsection 2.3(5.2) of National Instrument 81-101 Mutual Fund Prospectus Disclosure, is \$850 for each mutual fund.
- (2) **Subsection 2(2) of the Schedule to the regulations is amended by the deletion of the words “form of preliminary prospectus or pro forma prospectus” and the substitution of the words “form of preliminary, pro forma or other prospectus”.**
2. **These regulations come into force on March 3, 2025.**

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 amends subsections 2(1) and (2) of the Schedule to the *Securities Act* Regulations (EC57/08) regarding the fees that are payable to the Superintendent for the specified applications and filings.

SECTION 2 provides for the commencement of the regulations.
