TAX EXEMPTION PERMITS

Certain "Marked Gasoline/Marked Diesel Oil and Levy Exemption Permits", issued pursuant to the Prince Edward Island *Gasoline Tax Act* and the *Climate Leadership Act*, expire on January 31, 2021.

All holders of fuel and levy exemption permits with an expiry date of January 31, 2021 must re-apply for a new permit.

In order to obtain new permits, an application form must be completed for **EACH OPERATION** that is eligible for an exemption. This application form must be completed on both sides in detail and signed in the space provided. Any requested additional information must be attached to the application.

Please note, an issuance fee of \$20.00 must accompany your application. This issuance fee must be paid before a "Marked Gasoline and/or Marked Diesel Oil and Levy Exemption Permit" may be issued.

All Core Fishers must be in compliance with subsection 8(1) of the *Certified Fisheries Organizations Support Act*.

All Farmers with Marked Fuel and Levy Exemption Permits due to expire January 31, 2021 must renew their bona fide farmer status, for the purpose of farm property assessment, along with their Marked Fuel and Levy Exemption Permit.

Completed applications, along with all required documentation, are to be returned to Taxation and Property Records Division, Department of Finance, P. O. Box 1150, Charlottetown, PE, C1A 7M8 or any Access PEI Office, **NO LATER THAN NOVEMBER 30, 2020.**
