- Significant residential development in the Cornwall area.

- Bus routes for the Colonel Gray family overlap with the Charlottetown Rural family.
- Spring Park Elementary is over capacity.
- Colonel Gray Senior, Queen Charlotte Intermediate, Spring Park Elementary are projected to be over capacity by 2022.
- Birchwood Intermediate School, Parkdale Elementary School, Prince Street Elementary School, St. Jean Elementary School, and West Kent Elementary School are under-utilized.
- Operating and maintenance costs for Parkdale, Prince St., St. Jean, and West Kent are above average for an elementary school.
- Operating and maintenance costs for Birchwood are above average for an intermediate school.
- Residential development continues in the West Royalty area.

A more in-depth study of each school in the Colonel Gray family be completed in conjunction with the Charlottetown Rural family.
