Home Learning Activities grades 1-3

General guidelines for parents or guardians :

- Below you will find a list of activities (both online and offline) that you may use to support your child while they continue to learn from home. If something is too difficult, students can move on to something else.
- There will be no testing on the activities provided here.
- Consider completing a variety of literacy, numeracy, health and well-being activities during the week.

*Begin by creating a learning space for your child (with paper, pencils, crayons, markers, notebooks, notepads, etc...) if possible.

Literacy

Oral language communication in French:
20 min./day

- ✓ Put on a play in French (using dolls, stuffed animals, puppets, figures etc..)
- ✓ Share in French, via Facetime or other app, with classmates favorite books read, opinions and feelings about age appropriate subjects
- ✓ Play 'I spy' in French. 'Je vois.....'
- ✓ View movies or music in French on Youtube (age appropriate). Suggest a classmate watch the same movie or music to discuss afterward.

Reading:
20-50 min./day

* Online resources available through Provincial libraries. No need for a library card.

<p>Writing: 20 - 30 min/day</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ✓ Journal about your daily life or about books that you are reading. ✓ Free choice writing: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Make up a story orally and then write it down. ○ Write about the small moments in the day – the funny, sad, challenging moments all make for great stories. ○ Descriptive or poetic pieces following a walk in nature – journal using your 5 senses about your adventure (sight, sound, touch, taste, hear) ○ Instructions on how to do a craft project to share with a classmate ✓ Send messages to classmates in French. ✓ Keep a Reader’s Journal about the books you are reading. Write about favorite parts in a story, share your opinion about the story, or draw a picture about the story. <p>Other Ideas:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Bake/cook with a family member

Numeracy (30 minutes per day)

✓ **Counting**

- Grades 1 and 2: grouping small objects (20-100) in groups of 10, 5, 2.
- Grade 3: grouping small objects (100-1000) in groups of 25 and 10)
- Counting dimes and nickels (counting by 10s and 5s). While counting, ask questions with many possible answers (example: how many dimes make 50 cents, etc)

✓ **Card Games**

- Crazy 8s
- Scat
- 7-up
- Speed
- Solitaire games.

✓ **Board Games**

- Checkers
- Battleship
- Perfection (shapes)
- Jenga (problem solving)
- Junior Monopoly
- Pay Day
- Games with dice such as Yahtzee

- ✓ **Cooking/Baking** Following simple recipes- measuring ingredients and following directions, clean up.

- ✓ **Puzzles** (24-100 pieces)

- ✓ **Building** (Lego, 3D objects, blocks, etc.)

- ✓ **Online Websites/Apps** --Re-visit online math games that have been introduced to students in class previously (see teacher blogs), or try:
