

## French Immersion Program

### Home Learning Activities for Kindergarten

***General guidelines for parents or guardians :***

- Below you will find a list of activities (both online and offline) that you may use to support your child while they continue to learn from home. If something is too difficult, students can move on to something else.
- There will be no testing on the activities provided here.
- Consider completing a variety of literacy, numeracy, health and well-being activities during the week.

\*Begin by creating a learning space for your child (with paper, pencils, crayons, markers, notebooks, notepads, etc...) if possible.

#### Literacy

**Oral language communication in French:**  
20 min./day

- \*For each activity, use as many French words as possible
- ✓ Make up a story in English
  - ✓ Put on a play in English (with puppets, figures, dolls, stuffed animals, costumes)
  - ✓ Talk with a friend or classmate via Facetime or other app
  - ✓ View French movies or music on Youtube (age appropriate).

**Reading:**  
20-30 in./day

- \*Online resources available through Provincial libraries. No need for a library card.
- ✓ Make a reading fort for you and your child
  - ✓ Read aloud to your child and talk about the book (before, during and after reading)
  - ✓ Listen to a story in French and talk about it, using as many French words as possible

	<p><a href="#">BgB27QLHvyw447FGibS ECGAh4jqQ-qG6 hBAyf6HvntimgSOATFrZw</a></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Make and place cards throughout the house with words that your child is learning in school.(Ex. la, le,un une, maman, papa, voici, j'aime, je, je vois, petit) Each time your child finds one, he or she can read it, say the letters, try it out in a sentence and write it. Challenge your child to find 5 cards per day.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Writing:</b> 20 - 30 min/day</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ Draw a picture about your day or how you are feeling- label names of family members and things in French when possible</li> <li>✓ Draw a picture of a book you have read</li> <li>✓ Write or draw a story</li> <li>✓ Make a note/card for a family member or classmate.</li> <li>✓ Make a journal 'Je vois...I see'. Keep track of things you see when out for walks with your family</li> <li>✓ Make letters or words using playdough or macaroni, or objects found around the house</li> </ul>
<p><b>Other Ideas:</b></p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Listen to songs/videos in French</li> <li>○ Bake/cook with a family member</li> <li>○ Do a scavenger hunt with your child. Have your child tell you the colour or the name of the object in French.</li> <li>○ Make up a game of 'Go fish' using alphabet letters. Ask your child to name the letters in French.</li> <li>○ French games and videos online: <a href="https://ici.radio-canada.ca/jeunesse/prescolaire">https://ici.radio-canada.ca/jeunesse/prescolaire</a></li> </ul>
<p><b>Numeracy (10-15 minutes per day)</b></p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>✓ <b>Card games:</b> Go fish, Memory, Old Maid.</li> <li>✓ <b>Counting:</b> Household objects (ex. utensils, plates, cups when setting the table), Toys (teddies, Lego, blocks, cars, etc.)</li> <li>✓ <b>Sorting objects:</b> by colour, size, shape. (organizing toys would be a great way to practice sorting)</li> <li>✓ <b>Building:</b> Lego, blocks, boxes.</li> <li>✓ <b>Puzzles:</b> boxed puzzles of 12-24 pieces, word puzzles to solve, treasure hunts with clues.</li> <li>✓ <b>Shapes:</b> Hunting for shapes around the house or in the yard (circles, squares, rectangles, triangles) and practicing drawing them.</li> </ul>	

- ✓ **Board games:** Snakes and Ladders, Sorry, Memory. Any game where they have to count their winnings- Hungry Hippos, Jumping Monkeys, Pick-up Sticks, etc.
- ✓ **Cooking/Baking:** Helping with simple recipes- measuring, counting out ingredients.
