

PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND POPULATION REPORT THIRD QUARTER 2023

December 19, 2023

OVERVIEW

DIAGRAM 1: PRINCE EDWARD ISLAND POPULATION, QUARTERLY, 2019 - 2023



On December 19, 2023 Statistics Canada published its provincial population estimates for the third quarter of 2023. The data shows Prince Edward Island's population is estimated to be 175,853 as of October 1, 2023. This represents a yearly increase of 6,707 persons, the highest year-over-year increase on current record. The year-over-year growth rate was 4.0 per cent, the second highest growth rate among provinces and territories, behind Alberta at 4.3 per cent growth. This compares to a rate of 3.2 per cent for Canada as a whole.

The quarterly estimates since July 1, 2021 and growth rates for Canada and Prince Edward Island can be seen in Table 1.

All jurisdictions recorded population increases October 1, 2023 compared to October 1, 2022. Population estimates for October 1, 2022 and 2023 for all provinces and territories are shown in Table 2 below. The population growth rates and level change for the twelve-month period ending September 30, 2023 are also included.

COMPONENTS OF GROWTH

The total increase in PEI's population from July 1, 2023 to September 30, 2023 was 2,066 people.

Natural Increase

There were 349 births and 362 deaths on Prince Edward Island from July 1, 2023 to September 30, 2023, resulting in natural growth (births minus deaths) of -13.

International Migration

The third quarter of 2023 saw 825 immigrants come to PEI. On a year-over-year basis, this is a 1.2 per cent decline (as compared to the third quarter of 2022). At a rate of 4.7 per thousand¹, the province had the second highest quarterly immigration rate in the country, behind Saskatchewan at 5.0 per thousand. The immigration rate for Canada was 2.7 per thousand.

Net international migration for PEI was estimated to be 2,228 persons during the third quarter of 2023. This consisted of the 825 international immigrants, 1,384 non-permanent residents (net), and 98 returning Canadians entering the province, while 79 international emigrants left the province. Net international migration for PEI over the last 12-month period (October 2022 to September 2023) was 5,405. This compares to 4,158 over the previous 12-month period.

Net non-permanent residents (NPRs)² was 1,384 for the third quarter of 2023, following 860 for the second quarter. This brings the total number of NPRs in PEI to 11,337, consisting of 5,978 work permit holders, 4,204 study permit holders, 809 both work and study, 323 other permit holders, and 23 asylum claimants. NPRs include foreign workers, foreign students, the humanitarian population and other temporary residents. The humanitarian population includes refugee claimants and temporary residents who are allowed to remain in Canada on humanitarian grounds and are not categorized as either foreign workers or foreign students.

Inter-provincial Migration

A total of 1,059 inter-provincial migrants came to PEI during the third quarter of 2023, while 1,208 people left the province for other areas of Canada, for a net interprovincial loss of 149 people. This compares to a net loss of 30 persons over the same period in 2022. As shown in Table 3, the primary source of PEI's interprovincial in-migrants during this period was from Ontario, followed by British Columbia and Alberta. The main destinations of out-migrants from Prince Edward Island were Alberta, Ontario, and Nova Scotia. 37.4 per cent of all interprovincial migrants from other provinces were destined for Alberta.

¹ Immigration rates are calculated by the PEI Statistics Bureau based on Statistics Canada population estimates.

² NPR estimates are based on the number of NPRs, not on the net. The number of people in IRCC's administrative system is estimated on a specific date in each period of observation. First, the end-of-period number of NPR is estimated, and then the start-of-period number of NPR is subtracted from that estimate. That yields the net number of NPR.


