Contrary to popular belief, you don't need extensive schooling and post-grad education to pursue a rewarding career in healthcare. Some roles require as little as 2 years of college and training.

The healthcare field is experiencing rapid growth, particularly with the expanding population of Prince Edward Island. Now more than ever, we require committed professionals to cater to the island's changing healthcare needs.



Terms to Know

ACUTE CARE: Healthcare where a patient receives active but short-term treatment for an injury, urgent medical condition, or during recovery. Acute care services are generally delivered by teams of health care professionals from a range of medical and surgical specialties. Acute care may require a stay in a hospital emergency department, ambulatory surgery center, urgent care center, or other short-term stay facility, along with the assistance of diagnostic services, surgery, or follow-up outpatient care in the community. Acute care focuses on stabilizing patients and addressing their urgent medical needs in hospitals, emergency departments, urgent care centers, and other healthcare settings equipped to handle acute medical situations.

LONG TERM CARE: Specialized nursing and personal care services provided to individuals who can no longer live on their own, with family or home care support. These services are provided while respecting each resident's dignity and personal choices. This usually involves working with the aged population. Services are provided in both public and private long-term care nursing homes and include: 24-hour nursing care, room and board, personal care, and medical services.

OUTPATIENT CARE: Medical treatments/services that do not require patients to stay overnight in a hospital or healthcare facility. This type of care is typically for diagnosis, treatment, consultation, and follow-up services. It is designed for patients who can manage their conditions at home with periodic visits to a healthcare provider.

PRIMARY CARE: Primary care is the first point of contact in the healthcare system for individuals seeking medical attention. This involves basic health services provided by doctors, nurses, or physician assistants who help individuals with general health issues and routine check-ups. It also involves a broad range of health services aimed at preventing, diagnosing, and treating common illnesses and conditions. Primary care providers offer comprehensive, accessible, and continuous care for individuals of all ages. They coordinate patient care, manage chronic diseases, and refer patients to specialist physicians when necessary.

NOC: National Occupational Classification. You can search the NOC code listed to find where an occupation is classified and to learn about its main responsibilities, the education requirements, the average salary across the country, and the job outlook.

Addiction Counselor

NOC CODE 41301

Addiction Workers are part of the multi-disciplinary team providing in and out-patient support and services across the province.

Addiction Worker

NOC CODE 42201

Those who struggle with substance abuse and addiction require the skills of qualified Addiction Counsellors. An Addiction Counselor works with individuals experiencing problematic substance use and addiction and their family members who are negatively impacted by addiction.

Audiologist

NOC CODE 31112

Audiologists are hearing health professionals who identify, diagnose and manage individuals with hearing loss. Audiologists are skilled in the use of technology to support such individuals. As highly skilled professionals, audiologists are qualified to assess, diagnose and treat a broad range of hearing problems in infants, children and adults.

Biomedical Engineering Technologist

NOC CODE 22310

Biomedical Engineering Technologists inspect, test, maintain, and perform repairs on biomedical equipment in Health PEI facilities. These experts have a love for technology and are able to innovate and improve medical systems and devices effectively.

Cardiology Technologist

NOC CODE 32123

Cardiology technologists perform cardiac testing, ambulatory monitoring, and evaluating the human heart and its function. These tests provide physicians with the information they need to effectively diagnose and treat heart disease.

Certified Orthotists design and fit many types of orthotic devices (braces) used to support or correct the function of a limb or torso. When these body parts are too damaged to be repaired, Certified Prosthetists construct and fit prosthetic devices (artificial limbs) to replace missing or damaged limbs.

Clinical Chemist

NOC CODE 21101

Clinical Chemists are PhD level scientists with specialized training in laboratory medicine. They lead Health PEI's provincial clinical biochemistry program ensuring consistent high quality, accurate and precise biochemical test results are provided to support quality patient care. They provide expert technical and scientific advice for laboratory staff across the province and are responsible for ensuring that testing procedures comply with clinical and professional standards.

Combined technicians are also responsible for maintaining and calibrating lab and imaging equipment, verifying results, and recording data.

Dental Assistant

NOC CODE 33100

The dental assistant's role is to assist the dentist at the chair side. Dental Assistants provide clinical functions that include (but are not limited to) providing information on preventing dental diseases, providing intra-oral care such as the application of fluoride to prevent tooth decay, taking radiographs, making dental impressions of the mouth and the sterilization of instruments in the dental office. Non-clinical functions of Dental Assistants include working at the front desk as receptionists, and in many practices, helping to manage the dental office.

Dental Hygienist

NOC CODE 32111

Dental Hygienists are professional licensed members of the oral health care team who provide dental hygiene treatment and focus on prevention of diseases and disorders of the teeth and mouth. These include treatment of gum diseases, application of fluoride and/or dental sealants to prevent tooth decay, scaling, polishing and oral health education.

Dentist

NOC CODE 31110

Dentists are healthcare professionals who specialize in diagnosing, preventing, and treating oral health issues. Dentists perform routine check-ups, clean teeth, fill cavities, extract teeth, and treat various dental diseases. They also educate patients on proper oral hygiene and may perform cosmetic procedures to improve the appearance of teeth.

Development Worker

NOC CODE 42201

Development Workers are trained to provide care to meet the needs of young adults with moderate to severe developmental and physical disabilities who live in a group setting. Working as part of a multidisciplinary team, Development Workers meet the physical, social and recreational needs of individual residents and liaise with families.

Electromyography & Electroencephalogram tech use their expertise to understand the electrical activity of the brain, muscles and nervous system, with electronic diagnostic equipment.

NOC CODE 21120

Environmental Health Officers promote and protect the health and safety of the public by educating workers and the public on safe food handling techniques, conducting risk assessments, consultations, outbreak investigations and inspections in public and private services and facilities (restaurants, swimming pools etc.).

Family Physician

NOC CODE 31102

Family Physicians diagnose and treat diseases, physiological disorders and injuries. You'll assess people's symptoms, run tests to diagnose their conditions, prescribe medications or treatments, or refer people to specialists. Primary care begins in the office of the Family Physician.

Food Service Supervisor

NOC CODE 62020

Food Service Supervisors are responsible for the supervision of staff related to the preparation, serving and delivery of meals, as well as assisting with the implementation of diet orders and menu completion in accordance with the nutritional needs of the patient/client while ensuring that safe and sanitary work procedures are followed.

Health Information Management Professional

NOC CODE 12111

Health Information Management professionals, also known as coders, collect information from patient charts, such as diagnosis and interventions, and select the corresponding ICD-10 CA and CCI codes, validate data collected, in accordance with relevant legislation, regulations best practices.

If you want to work in health care, but don't want to be around blood and you're detailed oriented and like to figure things out (*like a detective*), the HIM profession is for you!

Health Information Specialist

NOC CODE 12111

The primary role of a Health Information Specialist is to collect, analyze and report on health care data to support decision-making. Health Information Specialists work closely with key stakeholders to foster knowledge dissemination and to support managerial decisions with relevant information on a wide variety of health care priorities.

NOC CODE 13112

Health Unit Coordinators coordinate the activities and documentation for patients on the ward (unit) with other services and departments in the hospital or health care facility.

Home Support Worker (HSW)

NOC CODE 42201

HSW help home care clients to remain in their own homes and community as long as possible. By providing personal care, respite services, and assistance with household tasks, they work independently and are an integral part of the interdisciplinary home care team. They work closely with clients and their family and community support.




