The Integrated Palliative Care Program is designed to offer comfort and support to those living with a life threatening illness. The team works with the individual and family members to ensure they are living fully to the end of life with dignity and comfort, surrounded by a circle of support.

Adult Protection

offers assessment and assistance to vulnerable adults who are unable to protect themselves from various forms of neglect or abuse.

Home Care Liaison Coordinator

is based at the Kings County Memorial Hospital and provides support for a safe and prompt return home by working with the individual, families and hospital staff.

Health PEI

The Home Care Program assists residents of Kings County to maintain their independence by continuing to live safely at home or to return home from hospital.

Services are provided free of charge. Individuals are responsible for providing any equipment and supplies required for their care.

Home Care services support the care provided by the individual and their families, friends and other community based services. Services are provided based on assessed need for a defined period of time.

A plan for care is developed and regularly reviewed with individuals and their families.

We respond to inquiries or requests for service within 48 business hours.

The following services are available:

Nursing

provides support to individuals and their families through teaching and offers a wide variety of nursing procedures.

Home Support

provides assistance to individuals with activities of daily living such as bathing and dressing. Home support workers also provide respite for the 24 hour caregiver to have a short planned break.

Social Work

provides the social context for assessing resources of the individual and those of their family. The social worker provides individual or family counseling to help cope with illness, loss, or end of life issues.



Physiotherapy

is offered on a consultant basis. The physiotherapist will work with the client and family to develop a plan to maximize independence, function and mobility. The physiotherapist instructs and educates on exercise programs and fall risk management.

Occupational Therapy

provides assistance to individuals who are having difficulty in their daily living (self care, work and/or leisure). The occupational therapist may provide training in daily living activities, recommend special devices or equipment, or advice on modifications in an individual's home or workplace to allow for safe and independent function.

Community Support

provides assistance to individuals who are having difficulty finding additional services and supports. The community support worker may also work with community groups in developing services to meet community needs.

Dialysis

provides support for individuals who require peritoneal dialysis in their own home. For those requiring Hemo Dialysis, units are located at Souris Hospital.
