



Information for Parents of Grade 3 Students

Dear Parents and Guardians:

In June, Grade 3 students in Prince Edward Island will take part in a common assessment of mathematics skills.

The Primary Math Assessment will measure the knowledge and skills learned in mathematics up to the end of Grade 3. The assessment is developed by teachers, based on the curriculum that students learn every day in class.

The assessment will be held on June 5th and June 6th, 2019. It will include questions on four strands of math: number; patterns and relations; shape and space; and, statistics and probability. Our province has common assessments in math and literacy at grades 3, 6, 9 and 11. The assessments will tell parents more about how their child performed on this assessment at a key stage of learning. The assessment will also provide teachers with information to guide teaching and learning.

You will receive your child's individual provincial results in the fall of 2019.

Since the assessment covers all areas of Grade 3 math, students can prepare by reviewing what they have learned this year in math. Parents can help by insuring that students arrive at school well-rested and ready to participate. Parents should encourage students to do their best.
