AND WHEREAS the Minister, on the advice of the Chief Public Health Officer, has determined that an emergency continues to exist in Prince Edward Island as a result of COVID-19 (coronavirus), which requires continued co-ordination of action or special regulation of persons or property to protect the health, safety or welfare of people;

AND WHEREAS, pursuant to subsection 15(2) of the *Emergency Measures Act*, a state of emergency may be renewed by the Minister, with the approval of Council;

RENEWAL OF PROVINCIAL STATE OF EMERGENCY**

AND WHEREAS a state of public health emergency was declared in the Province on March 16, 2020 pursuant to Order in Council EC2020-174 which was continued on April 15, 2020;

AND WHEREAS I declared a state of emergency in the Province effective April 17, 2020, pursuant to subsection 9(1) of the *Emergency Measures Act*;

AND WHEREAS, on the advice of the Chief Public Health Officer, I am satisfied that an emergency, as defined in subsection 1(c) of the *Emergency Measures Act* continues to exist;

AND WHEREAS under a state of emergency, I may require any or all of the actions specifically listed under subsections 11(a) to (k) of the *Emergency Measures Act*, or anything else I determine is necessary for the protection of property, the environment and the health or safety of persons in the Province;

NOW THEREFORE, with the approval of the Lieutenant Governor in Council, I renew the declaration of a state of emergency throughout the whole of the Province of Prince Edward Island to continue on and after **11:59 pm on April 30, 2020**.

If this declaration is not renewed or terminated earlier, the state of emergency remains in effect until **11:59 pm on May 31, 2020**.

TAKE NOTICE THAT this renewed declaration is in addition to and does not replace any Order issued by the Chief Public Health Officer under the *Public Health Act*, RSPEI 1988, c P-30.1.

MINISTERIAL ORDER

WHEREAS by Order and Declaration effective April 17, 2020, I declared that a state of emergency exists throughout the whole of the Province of Prince Edward Island as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, which was renewed on April 30, 2020;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to section 11 of the Act, I am authorized to do everything necessary for the protection of property, the environment and the health or safety of persons within the Province;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to my authority described in section 11 of the Act, and after consultation with the Chief Public Health Officer, I have determined that it is necessary and advisable for the health, safety, and welfare of the people of Prince Edward Island, to make the following orders.

THEREFORE I hereby issue a renewed order as follows.

1. In this Order:
 - (a) “essential services” means services that, if interrupted, would endanger the life, health, or personal safety of the whole or part of the population. A list of examples of essential services is published at:

<https://www.princeedwardisland.ca/en/topic/covid-19>.
 - (b) “peace officer” includes a police officer or any other person designated or appointed as a peace officer under any law of Prince Edward Island.
2. Every person arriving on Prince Edward Island at any and all points of entry, including by motor vehicle, airplane, helicopter, marine vessel, or otherwise, shall stop when instructed to do so by a peace officer, and answer any such questions and undergo such examinations as required by a peace officer, the Chief Public Health Officer, or any person assigned by the Chief Public Health Officer to conduct questioning and examinations.
3. All non-essential travel into Prince Edward Island is prohibited, and peace officers are hereby authorized to turn persons away when they attempt to enter the Province, and to require such persons to leave the Province immediately.
4. Non-essential travel includes but is not limited to the following:
 - (a) persons entering the Province to make or receive non-essential purchases, sales, and deliveries;
 - (b) persons entering the Province to visit, tour, sight-see, or for other social or recreational purposes; and

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- (c) such other classes of non-essential travel as the Chief Public Health Officer or her designate may direct.
5. The following does not constitute non-essential travel:
- (a) Prince Edward Island residents who have been out of the Province temporarily and are returning home;
 - (b) persons entering the Province to provide essential services in the Province, as defined above;
 - (c) persons entering the Province for emergency medical purposes, including patients and persons necessary to travel with patients, and persons accompanying animals for emergency services at the Atlantic Veterinary College;
 - (d) commercial vehicle drivers delivering goods;
 - (e) persons exercising or facilitating custody and / or access with children; and
 - (f) persons entering the Province in exceptional circumstances or on compassionate grounds, as determined by the Chief Public Health Officer or her designate, subject to conditions that may be imposed by the Chief Public Health Officer or her designate.
6. Except as permitted under this Order, persons arriving at the Province are prohibited from entering upon, and traveling into the Province from, any of the following areas:
- (a) the highway at the entrance to the Confederation Bridge;
 - (b) the highway at the entrance to the Wood Islands ferry terminal;
 - (c) the highway at the entrance to the Souris ferry terminal;
 - (d) the highway or street at the entrance to the Charlottetown airport;
 - (e) any port, harbour, wharf, launching, beach, and any part of the shoreline of the Province; and
 - (f) any and all other points of entry to the Province.
7. Where any person enters Prince Edward Island in contravention of this order, a peace officer is hereby authorized and directed to return that person to an interprovincial border and require the person to leave the Province immediately.
8. Every person who enters the Province must comply with all orders and directions issued by the Chief Public Health Officer, including her order effective May 1, 2020.
9. This Order is effective on May 1, 2020 at 12:00 a.m. and remains in effect until May 31, 2020 at 11:59 p.m.

PUBLIC HEALTH ORDER

TO: All persons residing in or present in Prince Edward Island; and

All businesses and organizations operating or carrying on business in Prince Edward Island;

WHEREAS a state of public health emergency was declared in Prince Edward Island on March 16th, 2020 pursuant to Order in Council EC2020-174, and continued on April 15th, 2020 by Order in Council EC2020-254;

AND WHEREAS the Chief Public Health Officer, pursuant to section 39(2) of the *Public Health Act*, RSPEI 1988, c P-30.1 (the “Act”), believes on reasonable and probable grounds that:

- (a) a communicable disease exists in the Province;
- (b) the communicable disease presents a risk to the health of persons in the Province; and
- (c) the requirements specified in the order are necessary to prevent, decrease or eliminate the risk to health presented by the communicable disease.

AND WHEREAS pursuant to subsection 39(1) of the Act, the Chief Public Health Officer may require a person to take or refrain from taking any action that is specified in the order in respect of a communicable disease;

AND WHEREAS the reasons for the order are the global COVID-19 pandemic, the health risks posed by the pandemic, and the necessity to prevent, decrease and eliminate those health risks;

AND WHEREAS pursuant to section 56 of the Act, the Chief Public Health Officer may require any person to provide information that the Chief Public Health Officer reasonably considers necessary to:

- (a) assess the threat that a disease presents to public health and plan for and address the threat; or
- (b) evaluate and monitor the health and safety of the general public.

NOW THEREFORE, pursuant to my authority under sections 39(1), 49(3), and 56 of the Act, I hereby order as follows.

1. In this Order:

(a) “close contact” means:

- (i) A person who provides care for, lives with, or has close physical contact with a person who is confirmed or suspected to be infected with COVID-19; or
- (ii) A person who comes into direct contact with the infectious body fluids of a person who is confirmed or suspected to be infected with COVID-19.

A “close contact” does not include a person who consistently and appropriately uses personal protective equipment while caring for a person who is confirmed or suspected to be infected with COVID-19.

- (b) “essential services” means services that, if interrupted, would endanger the life, health, or personal safety of the whole or part of the population. A list of examples of essential services is published at:

- (c) “allowable services” means services that are not essential services and are appropriate to open to the public, as determined by the Chief Public Health Officer, with certain public health measures in place. A list of examples of allowable services is published at:

<https://www.princeedwardisland.ca/en/topic/covid-19>.

- (d) “self-isolate” means compliance with the following measures:

(i) A person must remain in their residence or residence grounds, except to seek medical care or due to extraordinary circumstances including reasons of personal safety. A person who resides in an apartment building, condominium, rooming house, or other attached housing must remain on the residence’s property and maintain a two-metre distance from other persons at all times while in common areas, corridors, stairwells, elevators, other shared spaces, and outdoors;

(ii) If a person must leave their residence or the residence’s property for a reason outlined in clause (i) above, the person must maintain a two-metre distance from other persons at all times, other than during treatment by a health care worker; and

(iii) all additional self-isolation requirements published at:

<https://www.princeedwardisland.ca/en/information/health-and-wellness/covid-19-self-isolation>

2. Every person arriving on Prince Edward Island at any and all points of entry shall:

- (a) stop when instructed to do so by a peace officer;
- (b) answer any questions posed and provide all information requested by a peace officer, public health official, or health practitioner, including but not limited to: name, place of ordinary residence, license plate number, contact information, travel details, reason for entering the Province, occupation, and symptom information;
- (c) if requested, submit to temperature tests and such other examinations as may be required;
- (d) declare if they are experiencing symptoms including coughing, difficulty breathing, or fever; and
- (e) provide complete details of their self-isolation plan.

3. Subject to the exceptions described in sections 4 and 5, persons entering, residing in or present in Prince Edward Island who fall under any of the categories below shall self-isolate for the period of time specified,

- (a) Persons identified as a close contact of a confirmed or suspected case of COVID-19, shall self-isolate for a period of 14 days from the last day of close contact, regardless of whether a negative test result for COVID-19 is received during that period.

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- (b) Persons diagnosed with COVID-19 shall self-isolate for a period of at least 14 days after the onset of symptoms and such additional time until the person is cleared by a public health official.
 - (c) Persons who are symptomatic and awaiting the results of a test for COVID-19 shall self-isolate as follows:
 - (i) Persons who are symptomatic with exposure criteria (history of travel or close contact with a positive case) shall self-isolate for 14 days from the date of the test, regardless of whether a negative test result is received during that period.
 - (ii) Persons who are symptomatic without exposure criteria (no history of travel, no known contact with a positive case) need not self-isolate after receipt of a negative COVID-19 test result, unless otherwise instructed by the public health official.
 - (d) Persons who have travelled outside Canada on and after March 8, 2020 shall self-isolate for 14 days from the date of their return to Canada or for the duration of their stay in the Province (if shorter than 14 days), regardless of whether a negative test result for COVID-19 is received during that period.
 - (e) Persons entering the Province from anywhere on and after March 21, 2020 shall self-isolate for 14 days or for the duration of their stay in the Province (if shorter than 14 days), regardless of whether a negative test result for COVID-19 is received during that period.
4. Health care workers are subject to the following requirements to self-isolate:
- (a) If diagnosed with COVID-19, health care workers shall self-isolate until they receive two negative test results (24 hours apart) and are cleared by a public health official.
 - (b) If symptomatic and awaiting the results of a test for COVID-19, health care workers shall self-isolate until a negative test result is received.
5. The following persons are exempt from the requirement to self-isolate prescribed in clauses 3.(d) and (e), however, they shall self-isolate for the duration of their stay in the Province (if 14 days or less), other than when they are performing work duties:
- (a) Asymptomatic workers engaged in providing services in the trade, transportation, construction, agriculture, fisheries, aquaculture and livestock sectors including truck drivers and crew on any airplane, helicopter or marine vessel arriving in Prince Edward Island from another province or territory in Canada.
 - (b) Asymptomatic workers essential to the critical maintenance of the Province's infrastructure, in the trade, transportation and healthcare sectors.
 - (c) Asymptomatic workers engaged in providing essential services in the Province, including but not limited to, health and social service providers (excluding long-term care workers returning from out-of-province), postal service workers, members of a police service, others employed for the preservation of the peace, fire fighters, and emergency responders, except those workers who have travelled internationally since March 8, 2020 and have not yet completed 14 days of self-isolation upon return.
 - (d) Such other persons as may be otherwise exempted under exceptional circumstances by the Chief Public Health Officer.

6. Section 5 does not apply to temporary foreign workers.
7. Subject to section 8, effective April 17, 2020 at 8:00 a.m., all temporary foreign workers entering the Province shall self-isolate for 14 days at a quarantine facility designated by the Minister of Health and Wellness, regardless of whether a negative test result for COVID-19 is received during that period.
8. The following temporary foreign workers are exempt from the requirements in section 7:
 - (a) temporary foreign workers employed by an employer that has submitted a transition plan which addresses self-isolation requirements, and which plan has been approved by the Chief Public Health Officer; and
 - (b) such other temporary foreign workers as may be otherwise exempted by the Chief Public Health Officer under exceptional circumstances, provided satisfactory arrangements have been made for the temporary foreign worker to comply with self-isolation requirements.
9. Temporary foreign workers exempted from the requirements of section 7 who enter the Province shall remain subject to the requirement to self-isolate in accordance with this Order, an applicable transition plan, and applicable directions of the Chief Public Health Officer.
10. Effective March 17, 2020, businesses that are not an essential service or an allowable service shall not offer or provide services to the public at a location that is accessible to the public.
11. Businesses that are not an essential service or an allowable service may continue serving the public by means of telephone, virtual services, delivery, and pick-up, provided that owners and operators of those services comply at all times with the preventative measures described in section 12.
12. Owners and operators of workplaces that are permitted to operate under this Order, shall take the following preventative measures:
 - (a) take every reasonable step to ensure minimal interaction of people (including employees and/or clients) within two metres of each other;
 - (b) take every reasonable step required to prevent employees who are required to self-isolate as provided in section 3 from entering workplaces;
 - (c) develop and follow an exclusion policy that ensures symptomatic employees are immediately excluded from work activities;
 - (d) develop and follow an operational plan detailing how risk of transmission of disease will be mitigated;
 - (e) ensure enhanced cleaning and disinfection of shared areas and surfaces;
 - (f) ensure hand washing stations are available; and
 - (g) follow any other specific direction issued to the workplace by the Chief Public Health Officer.
13. No business may operate a video lottery terminal.
14. Community fundraising lotteries and activities may only operate virtually.

15. All child care facilities, including licensed and unlicensed centres, are closed to the public effective March 17, 2020, except for those licensed centres approved by the Department of Education and Lifelong Learning to offer child care services to essential service workers in accordance with the Chief Public Health Officer's "Conditions for Re-opening Selected Licensed Child Care Centres".
16. Indoor gatherings of any number of persons are prohibited, except in the following circumstances:
 - (a) facilities where health care or social services are provided;
 - (b) businesses or workplaces that are permitted to operate under, and to the extent of, this Order or any specific direction provided by the Chief Public Health Officer; and
 - (c) groups of persons living in the same household.
17. Outdoor gatherings of more than 5 persons from different households are prohibited. Any person who is gathering outdoors in a group of 5 persons or less from different households shall maintain a distance of two metres from other persons in the group. This prohibition does not apply to:
 - (a) businesses or workplaces that are permitted to operate under, and to the extent of, this Order or any specific direction issued to the business or workplace by the Chief Public Health Officer; or
 - (b) groups of persons living in the same household.
18. Visitation to nursing homes and community care facilities is prohibited, unless for exceptional and compassionate circumstances, including end of life.
19. This Order:
 - (a) revokes and replaces my order issued on April 16, 2020;
 - (b) is effective on May 1, 2020 at 8:00 a.m., except where stated in this Order to have retroactive effect; and
 - (c) shall remain in effect until May 22, 2020 at 8:00 a.m. unless earlier amended or revoked.

TAKE NOTICE that failure to comply with this Order is an offence for which you may be liable on summary conviction in accordance with section 66 of the *Public Health Act*.

ORDER

WHEREAS the *Municipal Government Act*, R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. M-12.1 (the “Act”) requires certain things in the Act to be done within a certain period of time;

AND WHEREAS section 49 of the *Public Health Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. P-30.1 allows the Lieutenant Governor in Council to make an order declaring a state of public health emergency with respect to all or any area of the province where, on the advice of the Chief Public Health Officer, the Lieutenant Governor in Council is satisfied that (a) a public health emergency exists or is imminent; and (b) prompt coordination of action or special measures are required in order to protect the public health;

AND WHEREAS a state of public health emergency was declared in the province on March 16, 2020 pursuant to Order in Council EC2020-174;

AND WHEREAS the Chief Public Health Officer believes on reasonable and probable grounds that as a result of COVID-19 a communicable disease exists in the province that presents a risk to the health of persons in the province and certain actions are necessary to prevent, decrease or eliminate the risk to health presented by the communicable disease;

AND WHEREAS the public and organizations in the province have been asked to avoid gatherings in order to protect the health of the population;

AND WHEREAS the disruption of activities required or enabled under the Act as a result of the prohibition on gathering and the current practice of social distancing has made the doing of the following things under the Act within the mandated periods of time difficult or inappropriate;

- Issuing notice of the receipt of proposals by the Island Regulatory and Appeals Commission (section 16 of the Act);
- Filing objections to proposals (subsection 17(1) of the Act);
- Appointing a mediator (subsection 17(6) of the Act);
- Commencement of mediation (subsection 17(7) of the Act);
- Submitting a report by the mediator (subsection 17(10) of the Act);
- Holding a hearing under subsection 17(12) of the Act;
- Preparing and providing a written report to the Minister (subsection 19(1) of the Act);

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- Setting a date for election day in the event of a vacancy on council and holding the by-election under section 60 of the Act;
 - Passing a Records Retention and Disposal Schedule Bylaw in accordance with subsection 117(1) and ministerial order dated October 30, 2019;
 - Passing an Access to Information and Protection of Personal Information bylaw in accordance with subsections 147(1) and 148(1) of the Act and ministerial order dated October 30, 2019;
 - Adoption of the municipality's financial plan under subsection 150(1) and filing of said financial plan under subsection 150(4) of the Act; and
 - Completing, distributing and publishing audited financial statements or review engagements and other financial documents in accordance with Part 6, Division 4 of the Act.

AND WHEREAS under subsection 8(2) of the Act, I have the authority to make an order extending the time required to do something under this Act;

AND WHEREAS for the reason stated above, I have determined that it is necessary authorize an extension of time for the matters listed above;

I THEREFORE ORDER that the time to undertake the actions for the matters listed above extended to:

- Within 45 days from either the date of receiving a proposal or of the lifting of the state of public health emergency, whichever is later, for the issuance of notice of the receipt of proposals (section 16 of the Act);
- Within 30 days of the dates listed in subsection 17(1) of the Act or of the lifting of the state of public health emergency, whichever is later, for the filing of objections to a proposal;
- Within 30 days of the receipt of an objection to a proposal by another municipality or of the lifting of the state of public health emergency, whichever is later, for the appointment of a mediator (subsection 17(6) of the Act);
- Within 30 days of the date of the appointment of the mediator or of the lifting of the state of public health emergency, whichever is later, for the commencement of mediation (subsection 17(7) of the Act);
- No later than 60 days after the commencement of mediation or of the lifting of the state of public health emergency, whichever is later, for the submission of a report by the mediator (subsection 17(10) of the Act);
- Within 30 days of the dates listed in subsection 17(12) of the Act or of the lifting of the state of public health emergency, whichever is later, for the holding of a hearing under subsection 17(12) of the Act;
- Within 45 days of the dates listed in subsection 19(1) of the Act or of the lifting of the state of public health emergency, whichever is later, for the written report to the Minister (subsection 19(1) of the Act);
- No later than six months from the vacancy on council or of the lifting of the state of public health emergency, whichever is later, for holding the by-election under section 60 of the Act;

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- No later than three months after the lifting of the state of public health emergency for passing a Records Retention and Disposal Schedule Bylaw (subsection 117(1) of the Act);
 - No later than three months after the lifting of the state of public health emergency for passing an Access to Information and Protection of Personal Information bylaw (subsections 147(1) and 148(1) of the Act);
 - No later than May 31, 2020 for the adoption of the municipality's financial plan under subsection 150(1) and no later than June 15 for the filing of said financial plan under subsection 150(4) of the Act; and
 - No later than September 30, 2020 for the submission by the auditor of a report to the chief administrative officer (section 174 of the Act);
 - No later than October 15, 2020 for the submission by the chief administrative officer to council and Minister of the information listed in section 175 of the Act; and
 - No later than October 31, 2020 for the publication of the auditor's report and the financial statements under section 177 of the Act.

AND I FURTHER THEREFORE ORDER that this order shall be effective the 16th of March, 2020.

LIQUOR CONTROL ACT
REGULATIONS
AMENDMENT

(Approved by Her Honour the Lieutenant Governor in Council dated April 28, 2020.)

Made by the Prince Edward Island Liquor Control Commission and approved by the Lieutenant Governor in Council under the *Liquor Control Act* R.S.P.E.I. 1988, Cap. L-14:

1. Section 50.3 of the *Liquor Control Act* Regulations (EC704/75) is amended by the addition of the following after subsection (12):

(12.1) Notwithstanding subsection (12), the Commission may waive the payment of an annual fee to operate a retail outlet at a place other than on the premises of the winery for the period from June 1, 2020, to May 31, 2021. Waiver of fee

2. Section 50.5 of the regulations is amended by the addition of the following after subsection (6):

(6.1) Notwithstanding subsection (6), the Commission may waive the payment of an annual fee to operate a retail outlet at a place other than on the premises of the distillery for the period from June 1, 2020, to May 31, 2021. Waiver of fee

3. Section 50.7 of the regulations is amended by the addition of the following after subsection (11):

(11.1) Notwithstanding subsection (11), the Commission may waive the payment of an annual fee to operate a retail outlet at a place other than on the premises of the micro-brewery for the period from June 1, 2020, to May 31, 2021. Waiver of fee

4. Section 57 of the regulations is amended by the addition of the following after subsection (4):

(5) Notwithstanding subsections (1), (1.1) and (3), the Commission may waive the payment of an annual fee to renew a license and any late renewal fee for the period from June 1, 2020, to May 31, 2021. Waiver of fees

5. Subsections 50.3(12.1), 50.5(6.1), 50.7(11.1) and 57(5) of the regulations are revoked on June 1, 2021.

6. These regulations come into force on May 2, 2020.

EXPLANATORY NOTES

SECTION 1 adds subsection 50.3(12.1) to the regulations, which provides for the Commission to waive the payment of an annual fee by the holder of a winery license to operate a retail outlet off premises for the period from June 1, 2020, to May 31, 2021.

SECTION 2 adds subsection 50.5(6.1) to the regulations, which provides for the Commission to waive the payment of an annual fee by the holder of a distiller's license to operate a retail outlet off premises for the period from June 1, 2020, to May 31, 2021.

SECTION 3 adds subsection 50.7(11.1) to the regulations, which provides for the Commission to waive the payment of an annual fee by the holder of a micro-brewery license to operate a retail outlet off premises for the period from June 1, 2020, to May 31, 2021.

SECTION 4 adds subsection 57(5) to the regulations, which provides for the Commission to waive the payment of an annual fee to renew a license and any late renewal fee for the period from June 1, 2020, to May 31, 2021.

SECTION 5 revokes the new provisions added to the regulations under sections 1 to 4, effective June 1, 2021.

SECTION 6 provides for the commencement of these regulations.
